SHROVE TUESDAY



Next Tuesday, 13th February is Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent, the 40 days leading up to Easter, was traditionally a time of fasting and on Shrove Tuesday, Christians went to confession and were forgiven for their sins.

Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the Lenten fast and pancakes are the perfect way of using up these ingredients.

The year 6-8 students will be preparing and cooking pancakes for us all on that day. Each class will go to the Sacred Heart Centre before recess to enjoy these yummy pancakes. Students please bring a gold coin donation on the day, all donations will go towards Project Compassion fundraising

ASH WEDNESDAY



Wednesday, 14th February is Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is one of the most well known and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer.

We will be holding the *Ash Wednesday Mass, at Star of the Sea Church at 11:45am*. During the Mass, we will receive ashes on the forehead. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the ashes are put on to a person's forehead, we are reminded to do good, with words such as: "Turn away from doing wrong and follow in God's way." Again, we would love to see the families and parishioners at the mass.

LENT

Lent is the six-week period leading up to Easter. As with Ash Wednesday, it is one of the most important times of year for many Christians around the world. Lent is seen as a time of solemn observance and preparation for the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter. From its start on Ash Wednesday until its conclusion on Easter Sunday, Lent has been a traditional time for fasting or giving something up and giving to the poor. Lent invites us to make our minds and hearts ready for remembering Jesus' life, death, and body resurrection.

CHINESE NEW YEAR AND LIGHT LANTERNS:

The Chinese New Year is celebrated on Saturday 10th February. The light lanterns used in celebration, symbolise driving



out darkness and bringing hope to the coming year.

The years of the Dragon include 2024 (this year), 2012, 2000, 1988, 1976, 1964, and 1952. Dragons are strong and independent figures, but they yearn for support and love. Dragons are wise and adventurous and, at times, temperamental and impulsive.
