Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of SMMS,

I was sharing with staff yesterday morning some reflections on the time of Lent being a time for preparation and renewal. As Christians we have so many opportunities through the grace of God to start afresh, put the past behind us and resolve to do things differently or better. Lent is one of those opportunities. Most of us would have a file of resolutions in the back of our mind. These are the ones we usually pull out on New Year's Eve or when Lent begins. Sometimes we are very fixed on our intentions or resolutions, and it takes trust to leave this in God's hands and be open to listening to and finding out what God has in mind for us. There might be some surprises.

It is hard to find stillness and quiet moments, so we must make them. Our times for staff prayer, classroom prayer and whole school meditation times are the times in our school that we set aside to do this.

Jesus said to his apostles: "Come by yourselves to an out-of-the-way place and rest a little." People were coming and going in great numbers, making it impossible for them to so much as eat. So Jesus and the apostles went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. (Mark 6:1-32).

While most of us are not able to leave everything behind and head off in a boat to a quiet place, I hope that you are able to find some moments of peace, quiet and stillness to listen to the whisperings in your heart of what God has in mind for you.

SUPPORTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

In Week 4 on Monday, 19 February, we will host a visit by Dr Bill Rogers and Suzanne Drew.

Dr. Bill Rogers taught for many years before becoming an education consultant and author; he lectures widely on behaviour management, discipline, effective teaching, stress management and teacher welfare across the UK and Europe, Australia and New Zealand. Bill also works as a mentor-teacher, team-teaching in challenging schools. He is well aware of the challenges of teacher leadership in schools today.

Bill will be introduced to students and staff at Monday morning assembly, then throughout the day visit every classroom. Bill will spend some of break times in the yard with students.

Bill will be facilitating a staff PD session for our staff after school. This is an incredible opportunity for our school, from one of the best in this field of behaviour education.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

NAPLAN

With today's Newsletter, parents of students in Years 3, 5 and 7 will receive a pamphlet produced by ACARA with information about the NAPLAN testing.

Students will have a practice test session on Tuesday, 27 February between 9-10am, this will include all Year 3, 5, 7 students. The practice test is an omnibus test, meaning it has samples of questions across all of the areas of testing: reading, language conventions and maths. The test is held in test conditions however teachers also have the flexibility in this time to explain to students the various tools on the computer they can use, how the questions are presented and ways they answer the questions (type in a response, choose an answer from multiple choice etc.). Teachers will continue to do writing practice in the genres of narrative and procedure with students. We do not receive any results from the practice test, the purpose is experience for the students.

The NAPLAN testing window is from 13-25 March. We have planned our main testing days for Wednesday 13, Thursday 14 and Friday 15 March with the following days available for catch up testing with students who are away.

If parents have any questions about the NAPLAN testing, I encourage you to have a conversation with your child's teacher.

Any requests for student withdrawal from NAPLAN testing are to be discussed prior to the testing commencing.

PERSONAL PLANS FOR LEARNING

As outlined last year, Personal Plans for Learning for students are in place for 12 months from the end of Term 1, 2023 until the end of Term 1, 2024. This is to ensure that there is not a period of time at the beginning of the year when there is not a revised plan in place. If your child was on a PPL last year in our school, this is the plan that is currently in place for your child. The only exception to this is students who are new enrolments, or they were not actually on a plan last year and the need has since evolved.

Teachers have begun the process of revising and writing new PPLs for students who require these. The aim will be to have these available for parents to discuss at the parent/teacher interviews to be held in Week 9 and 10 of this term.

FROM THE REC

Today we celebrated *Ash Wednesday* at Star of the Sea church with families, parishioners and the community. We all received ashes on our forehead to remember that during Lent especially, we need to turn away from doing wrong and follow God's way.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, which also marks the beginning of the annual *Caritas Australia Project Compassion**Appeal*. Donations to Project Compassion allow Caritas Australia, the Catholic Agency for International Aid and Development, to work with local communities around the world to end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity.

This year, the theme is 'For All Future Generations'. This theme has been drawn from the story of the burning bush in Exodus 3:1-20.

One day, Moses's sheep wander off and he suddenly encounters a bush that is burning but not consumed. God tells Moses that he has heard the cry of his people. God responds to injustice and chooses Moses to speak to Pharaoh. Moses is scared but God promises 'I will be with you.' All the time, God remains a mystery. Moses wants more detail, so God simply says that this is the same God who has been longing for justice for the whole of history: 'By this name I shall be invoked for all future generations.'



As God called Moses, so now God calls us to work 'for all future generations.'

Kirsty Robertson, Caritas Australia CEO, said, "During Lent, we are invited to take up the call to fast, pray and give alms. From natural disasters to widespread conflict, the events of the past year mean that many communities need your support. During Sport Day practices and on the day, be like St Sebastian and show perseverance and strength with every event.




LITURGICAL COLOURS

- •Gold or White Christmas and the Christmas Season; Holy Thursday; the Easter Season; Feasts of Our Lady; Feasts of saints who were not martyrs; Feasts of Our Lord which do not recall his Passion (Christ the King, Corpus Christi)


