#### **CATHOLIC EDUCATION 200 YEARS**

#### This year we celebrate 200 years of Catholic Education in Australia.

In October 1820 Irish priest, Fr John Therry put his "Faith in the Future" when he founded the first Catholic school in Australia. That school, run by a former convict, George Marley, which Catholic historians believe was in Hunter Street, Parramatta, had 31 students.

Since that first school in Parramatta welcomed its foundation students, Catholic schools have educated millions of Australian children. As the largest provider of schooling in Australia (outside government), we now educate one in five Australian school-age children. This represents some 768,000 students in 1,751 schools across the country, with about 40 per cent located in regional, rural and remote communities, and employing 98,000 teachers and staff.

Throughout this year our school will celebrate this milestone along with our other Catholic schools across South Australia and Australia.

With today's Newsletter, each family receives a prayer card for celebrating 200 years of Catholic Education in Australia.

#### 7-9 PROJECT

With today's Newsletter is our next monthly update of progress with our 7-9 building and planning. Please do not hesitate to pass on any questions or information that you would like covered in our monthly updates.

#### YEAR 7 AND 8 ENROLMENT 2022

We are currently seeking expressions of interest from families for Year 7 and 8 in 2022. To assist with our future planning it is essential that we have an indication from our current families whether you wish your child to remain with us for Year 7 and 8 next year and into Year 9 for 2023. Please note that this is not binding, it is an expression of interest at this stage. Replies from all existing families would be much appreciated. If you know of any other families considering enrolling their child/children here for Year 7/8 in 2022 and Year 9 in 2023, please encourage them to contact our office and express their interest.

#### NAPLAN 2021

As previously mentioned, students in Years 3, 5 and 7 around Australia sit the NAPLAN tests. The NAPLAN tests are four individual tests which are used to determine a student's current level of understanding in the key areas of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (including Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy.

This year students will be sitting the NAPLAN tests online apart from Year 3 doing the writing test on paper. Students will be using the devices they are most used to for the tests (Lenovos and macbooks). In Week 9 of this term, Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> March (10.45-11.45am), all Year 3, 5 and 7 students will sit a national practice test. This test will give students an opportunity to experience the test situation, the different ways questions will be presented and the various online tools they can use. This practice test also tests our state and nation digital capacity for many students to be online at the same time. All students are strongly encouraged and supported to participate in both the practice test and the actual testing in Week 3-4 of next term. However, if parents wish to exempt or withdraw their child from the NAPLAN testing, please discuss this with your child's class teacher or myself and fill in the required paperwork prior to the end of this term. We will provide a detailed timetable at the beginning of Term 2 for the testing.

With today's Newsletter there is a NAPLAN information pamphlet for parents of students in Year 3, 5 and 7. There is also a NAPLAN privacy notice outlining the collection of information about students. If you have any further questions or concerns about your child participating in the tests, or any questions generally, please feel free to come and see your child's class teacher or myself.



#### FEE INCREASE IN OSHC – AFTER SCHOOL CARE

OSHC fees have recently been reviewed by St Mary MacKillop School Board and it has been decided to increase After School Fees from **27<sup>th</sup> April 2021**.

Operational Costs have been increasing in the last few years (since our last increase 8 years ago), in particular insurance, maintenance, equipment, materials, day to day costs and salaries.

Fees will be: After School Care: \$20 Please keep in mind your Child Care Subsidy will come off these fees.

Vacation Care Fees will remain the same but there will be an excursion levy added to the proposed excursion days. These extra charges will be added to your accounts and will be advised prior to the Vacation Care program.

A reminder for the families whom your CCS has been dropped off by Centrelink, please go to myGov and check your mail. We have been advised from other families they have had notices to accept enrolments or complete income estimates and were not aware the notices were there – hence their CCS has been withdrawn by Canberra. Check regularly on myGov website on desktop or laptop for any letters, notices or updates. If there is non-attendance for eight weeks your children will need to be re-enrolled.

Vacation Care program for the April school holidays was sent home in Week 5. Please ensure you only book for the days that you require as we have to allocate staff and provide a healthy food menu to cater for those booked in before the holiday period.

If your child is booked into OSHC and then does not need to attend for some reason, or is absent from school, you need to inform OSHC staff before 1.00pm or you may be charged. You can either call or send a TXT to 0437 659 137. Thank you.




