Last week we celebrated the Feast days of two very significant Saints for us:

#### ST PATRICK 17<sup>TH</sup> MARCH:

St Patrick is regarded as the founder of Christianity in Ireland, therefore the patron saint of Ireland.

When he was about sixteen, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland, he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. In later life, he served as a bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked.

The colour green and the shamrock are associated with St Patrick. St Patrick used the three-leaved shamrock to teach about the trinity: Father, Son Holy Spirit.

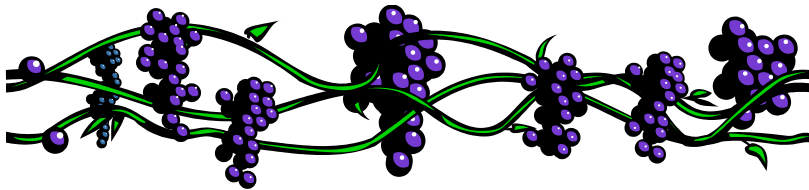

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### PROJECT COMPASSION - THANK YOU!

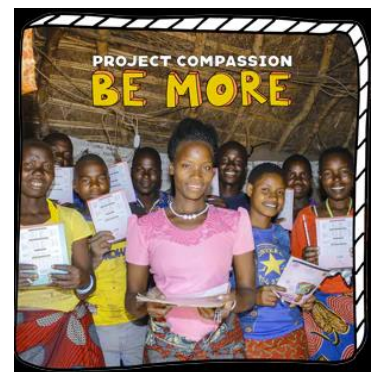
**It would be most appreciated if the family Project Compassion boxes could be returned by next Thursday,**

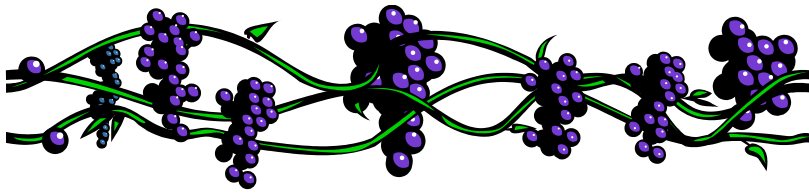


### HOLY WEEK

Next week, the holiest week of the Christian calendar, we remember and re-enact the events which occur for and to Jesus in the approach to celebrating the most important feast for the Christian faith – the rising to new life of Jesus at Easter.

Each class is remembering and presenting to the whole school an experience of Jesus during Holy Week. This will be presented in the order events occurred historically. All presentations will be in the Kalori Building MPLA. Parents are invited to attend the presentation of their child/children's class/classes.

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**PALM SUNDAY - 9:30am Reception / Year 1 Classes (Combe, Hanson and McCann), Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March** . (Please note, this will be following on from the Year 5/6 class Assembly)

Holy Week begins with Passion Sunday, also known as Palm Sunday, commemorating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Jesus, riding on the back of a young donkey, is welcomed into Jerusalem by a very happy crowd greeting Jesus with praise, 'Hosanna to our King', and throwing down cloaks and branches on the roadway in welcome.

**HOLY THURSDAY – THE LAST SUPPER – 9:30am Year 4/5, Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> March**

Jesus and his close friends, the apostles, gather in an upstairs room to celebrate a special Jewish meal together. Jesus washes the feet of his friends, ready to participate in the coming special meal, in a humble act of service. At this supper, Jesus instituted the Eucharist, the nourishment of our faith through the Body and Blood of Jesus. We remember and act upon the Last supper every time Mass is celebrated.

**JESUS IN THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE - 9:30am Year 5/6 Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April**

It is late after the meal together and Jesus knows the suffering that is coming to him. He goes out to the garden nearby to quietly pray. He asked his apostles to just sit with him and stay awake with him. They promptly fall asleep until Jesus is arrested. Jesus also had to deal with the sadness of his friend and disciple, Judas, betraying him to the Roman soldiers who had come looking for him in the garden.

**GOOD FRIDAY (Stations of the Cross) – 9:45am Year 6/7 Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> April (following on from the 5/6 presentation)**

The passion (suffering) and death of Christ is commemorated in our Christian churches on Friday of Holy Week – Good Friday. After his arrest by Roman soldiers, Jesus faces a harrowing time of interrogation, violence and deep disrespect. He is handed over to the Jewish elders who are actually afraid of his potential for power over them. They do not understand that his power is of God and of the heart. Good Friday culminates in the journey of Jesus to the cross, and his death, on Calvary. Jesus body is placed in a new cave tomb, belonging to one of his friends.

**EASTER – THE RESURRECTION – 9:30am Year 2 and Year 2/3 Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> April**

The celebration of the resurrection of Christ is the greatest and oldest festival in the Church.

We celebrate that Jesus rose from death to life after three days in the rock tomb. This is the foundational Christian belief - the Resurrection of Jesus Christ to New Life, new and eternal life with God.

We celebrate Easter with eggs – chocolate, lolly, marshmallow, painted. New life breaks out of lifeless looking eggs. Eggs are a symbol of new life, as are chicks. Butterflies are also an Easter symbol of new life. Nondescript bulbs that look quite lifeless but are the source of a beautiful flower springing forth are also symbols of new life at Easter.

## **FEE INCREASE IN OSHC – AFTER SCHOOL CARE**

OSHC fees have recently been reviewed by St Mary MacKillop School Board and it has been decided to increase After School Fees from **27<sup>th</sup> April 2021**.

Operational Costs have been increasing in the last few years (since our last increase 8 years ago), in particular insurance, maintenance, equipment, materials, day to day costs and salaries.

### Fees will be:

After School Care: \$20

Please keep in mind your Child Care Subsidy will come off these fees.

Vacation Care Fees will remain the same but there will be an excursion levy added to the proposed excursion days. These extra charges will be added to your accounts and will be advised prior to the Vacation Care program.

A reminder for the families whom your CCS has been dropped off by Centrelink, please go to myGov and check your mail. We have been advised from other families they have had notices to accept enrolments or complete income estimates and were not aware the notices were there – hence their CCS has been withdrawn by Canberra. Check regularly on myGov website on desktop or laptop for any letters, notices or updates. If there is non-attendance for eight weeks your children will need to be re-enrolled.

**If your child is booked into OSHC and then does not need to attend for some reason, or is absent from school, you need to inform OSHC staff before 1.00pm or you may be charged. You can either call or send a TXT to 0437 659 137. Thank you.**
