Dear Parents and Caregivers,

St Mary MacKillop certainly knew tough times and yet she never lost her faith and her hope that everything would turn out okay. St Mary MacKillop was a prolific writer and there is so much wisdom in her words; wisdom for all time. I have been thinking a lot about Mary MacKillop over this last week.

St Mary MacKillop, who knew many difficult and challenging times, wrote in 1890 ***“Keep your mind in peace whatever happens”***.

**What can we take from Mary MacKillop’s wisdom for these unpredictable times we find ourselves in?**

Today it has been great to welcome the wider community of students and staff back to school following our seven-day lockdown in SA. Our lockdowns have been so much briefer than those experienced by people interstate and it certainly deepens an understanding and compassion for them and what they have and are experiencing. Some of my key reflections from this most recent experience are to not take anything for granted, appreciate what you have, remain hopeful, be amazed at the resilience and goodness of those around me.

As we transition from lockdown there are restrictions in place for the next seven days - 28<sup>th</sup> July – Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> August inclusive.

As always, students should not attend school if they are unwell or are required to self-isolate/quarantine by SA Health. Please let us know if this is the case. Students in directed quarantine, will be provided with learning support.

We will not be offering an alternative home-based learning program unless your child is impacted by SA Health quarantine orders.

Please note that some government restrictions in place at present mean normal access to the school site by parents will not be possible during this time. I therefore ask you to follow the following guidelines if you are dropping your child off at school:

- Please use the drive-in Kiss and Go Zone or walk your child to the MPLA gates and Kiss and Go. Pick up at the end of the day follows these same guidelines.

Primary students are not required to wear masks, however may do so if they wish.

All adults coming into our school are asked to do so via the Front Office and wear a mask. Staff will not wear masks when engaged in face-to-face teaching of students.

- Speech Pathologists, OTs, Counsellor services commenced today.

As we transition back to schooling it will take time for all of us to adjust to the new requirements stipulated by the health authorities.

**Our school photos have been postponed from Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> July to Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> September.**

**We will not have our usual P & F Friday lunches this Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July – thank you to our wonderful coordinators Taya and Krystle. Please ensure you send your child/children's lunch this Friday.**

## REPORTING TERM 3

Previously our formal reporting to parents and caregivers for Term 3 has taken the form of parent – teacher interviews. We are keen to provide this reporting in a way that is more engaging and gives students more voice or agency and therefore developing personal responsibility. You received your child's Semester One report last week and this should provide a detailed summary of their progress, we want to provide you with a complementary experience to this towards the end of this term.

**In Week 8 of this term we ask all families to attend our compulsory Learning Expo.**

**The Learning Expo will be on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> September between 3.30-7.00pm.**

**All classrooms will be open with student learning and work samples displayed.**

R-3 students will take their family to their classroom and proudly share their work and learning. Class teachers and specialist teachers will be circulating and available to chat with you.

Year 4-7 students will engage their parents and caregivers in a conference where they will share a prepared reflection on their goals, what they have achieved, what they are going to continue to work on. Your Year 4-7 child will have some questions to ask of you as well.

On the same evening (all going well for completion!), we will have the 7-9 facility open for you to have a walk through.

## LIVING LEARNING LEADING SURVEY

The Living Learning Leading (LLL) Framework guides us in all that we do to help drive excellence in Catholic schools, and give life to the vision, values and mission of Catholic Education.

Students, Staff, Parents and Caregivers are invited to contribute via a survey that will help find out about the performance of this school.

Taking part in the survey offers an opportunity to tell the school staff how things are going for you and your children.

Your feedback is valued and every attempt will be made to try to respond to the information you provide.

The feedback does not include the data of individuals, rather the feedback involves graphs based on the collective feedback from all parents and caregivers.

It is your first impressions that we are seeking and there are no right or wrong answers. The response format requires you to consider the school's performance for each statement on a scale from 1-6 (with 1 being the lowest or worst score and 6 being the highest or best score).

Further information is provided in an accompanying flyer and the flyer includes the web address for the survey and the code to enter the survey.

The same opportunity is being offered to students in Years 2-7 in school and teaching staff.
