ST MARY MACKILLOP FEAST DAY

In the lead up to celebrating the Feast day of St Mary MacKillop, the Year 6 and 7 students will go on a pilgrimage to Sevenhill this Friday, 6th August. They will be accompanied by Lisa Caffyn, Hannah Cotter and Fr Matthew. Sevenhill is central to the history of the Jesuits and their mission in South Australia. Mary's links with the Jesuits are through Fr Julian Tenison Woods (a Jesuit priest) and through the Jesuits offering shelter to Mary when she was excommunicated from the Church.

There is a restored cottage at Sevenhill that Mary stayed in, that the students will visit. They will celebrate Mass in the Sevenhill church, participate in the stations of the cross set out in the Sevenhill grounds and visit the crypt where many Jesuit priests and brothers are buried.

This pilgrimage will be a wonderful experience to develop the students' spiritual leadership.

This Sunday, 8th August, the Feast of St Mary MacKillop, and the launch of Catholic Education Open Week will be celebrated with an Open Day at our school. The 7-9 building will not quite be ready for visitors, but will be soon!.

COVID-19 UPDATE

TERM 3 CURRICULUM LETTERS

With the Newsletter today you will receive the Science Curriculum letters relating to your child's learning with R/1 Science teacher Agatka Murphy and Year 2-5/6 teacher Amie Price.

Science Week is coming up in Week 5; the theme is "Food: Different By Design." We have some activities planned to celebrate the week and the important role that Science plays in our lives.

REPORTING TERM 3

Previously our formal reporting to parents and caregivers for Term 3 has taken the form of parent – teacher interviews. We are keen to provide this reporting in a way that is more engaging and gives students more voice or agency and therefore developing personal responsibility. The Semester 1 report you received Week 1 should provide a detailed summary of your child's progress, we want to provide you with a complementary experience to this towards the end of this term.

In Week 8 of this term we ask all families to attend our compulsory Learning Expo. The Learning Expo will be on Wednesday 8th September between 3.30-7.00pm. All classrooms will be open with student learning and work samples displayed.

R-3 students will take their family to their classroom and proudly share their work and learning. Class teachers and specialist teachers will be circulating and available to chat with you.

Year 4-7 students will engage their parents and caregivers in a conference where they will share a prepared reflection on their goals, what they have achieved, what they are going to continue to work on. Your Year 4-7 child will have some questions to ask of you as well.

On the same evening, we will have the 7-9 facility open for you to have a walk through.

There will be a sausage sizzle available between 5.00-6.00pm.

We look forward to welcoming you – put the date in your diary!

LIVING LEARNING LEADING SURVEY

The Living Learning Leading (LLL) Framework guides us in all that we do to help drive excellence in Catholic schools, and give life to the vision, values and mission of Catholic Education.

Students, Staff, Parents and Caregivers are invited to contribute via a survey that will help find out about the performance of this school. Taking part in the survey offers an opportunity to tell the school staff how things are going for you and your children.

Your feedback is valued and every attempt will be made to try to respond to the information you provide. The feedback does not include the data of individuals, rather the feedback involves graphs based on the collective feedback from all parents and caregivers.

It is your first impressions that we are seeking and there are no right or wrong answers. The response format requires you to consider the school's performance for each statement on a scale from 1-6 (with 1 being the lowest or worst score and 6 being the highest or best score).

Further information is provided in an accompanying flyer and the flyer includes the web address for the survey and the code to enter the survey. The survey will be open until Friday, 20th August.

The same opportunity is being offered to students in Years 2-7 in school and teaching staff.

St Mary MacKillop Feast Day 8 August - Celebrating our first Australian saint this week and next week!

Mary MacKillop was born January 15th, 1842, in Brunswick St, Fitzroy, Melbourne. With the



support and spiritual guidance of Fr. Julian tension Woods (pictured right in the painting of their friendship and planning), the Parish Priest of the South - East of South Australia, she opened the first St Joseph's school in Penola in 1866. It was in an old stable (pictured). Her brother helped her to make it habitable for a school room.

A whole school Mass in honour of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop will be celebrated



in the MPLA next Monday morning at 10:00am, (but without any parents or visitors). It will celebrate the deep connection of Mary MacKillop to God, whom she loves so much in the person of Jesus. Even in times of intense hardship, disappointment, loss of friendship and even betrayal, Mary MacKillop always welcomed the movement and wisdom of the Holy Spirit within her.

Mary MacKillop formed the first home-grown group of religious sisters in 1866 – the Sisters of St Joseph of the sacred Heart. She wrote frequent letters to her Sisters of St Joseph in order to support them in their very challenging work out in the bush of Australia, and eventually New Zealand. She knew that she needed to encourage these young women, some very young, to persist with their challenges, spiritual, social, educational and personal. Many of Mary's thoughts and letters, deeply supportive but entirely understanding of the immense challenges of the times and the environment, have been published.

Our classes are choosing a supporting quote from Mary MacKillop, reflecting on what it looks like for us today. Some of the quotes from her letters are shared below.

"When I could not see my way God kept my heart full of trust to make all come right," (Mary MacKillop 1874)

Mary wrote copious letters to her great friend and spiritual mentor, Fr. Julian Tenison Woods, as well as to her ever-growing numbers of new Sisters of St Joseph. These messages of hope, support and love of God in these letters even today, help us to understand God's presence in our lives and real presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives.


"Let God's Spirit guide you in your choice," (Mary MacKillop 1898)

There was a continuous inflow of young women joining Mary MacKillop and her group, whose lives were dedicated to God. However, many of these young women also didn't last any more than a year or two in these new group of Sisters of St Joseph. Many of the priests of South Australia and Victoria and Queensland were very keen to entice Mary and her sisters to set up Catholic schools in the far-flung areas of these states.

Our school was one of the early Josephite schools, established in 1869 because Jesuit priest, Fr. Kennedy wanted a Catholic school in this area. A "Sisters" school was also established in Kadina at the same time. Both schools amalgamated in 1975 when the Kadina Catholic School closed. The renewed school, here at Wallaroo, then became known as Kalori School, an Aboriginal word meaning message stick. Then thirty years later it became Kalori Catholic School. In 2010 this school became St Mary MacKillop School after Mary was named a saint by the Church because of her life spent helping those in need and witnessing to the love of God through Jesus.

Feast of the Assumption of Mary – Sunday 15 August

The Feast of the Assumption of Mary is a special Solemn Feast Day of the Catholic Church. On this day, the Church acknowledges that Mary, the mother of Jesus, has a special place in the life of the Catholic Church as the Mother of God. The Church Fathers proclaim the belief that Mary is pure, and at her death, Mary was "assumed" (taken) by God to be with God for Eternity.

On this day we specifically remember that Mary is the mother of Jesus, that she believed in Jesus and was one of his faithful followers and believers. She lived her life by saying "Yes" to God.

As Fr. Matthew has said, "When we make friends, we get to know our friend's mother. Jesus is our friend, so we get to know his mother, Mary."

The Year 4-7 classes will join together here at school, for the Mass of the Assumption Monday week.
