PAT TESTING


ADVENT IS COMING

The new Church Liturgical Year C begins 1st Sunday of Advent, 28 November. The Season of Advent, the time of personal preparation in readiness to celebrate the Feast of the Nativity, the Birth of Jesus – Christmas – extends for four weeks until Christmas. There are four Sundays of Advent and the liturgical colour for this season is violet (different to the deep purple of Lent which is a season of repentance).

We are unable to fully participate in Advent at the same time as the Church community as we finish our school year near the beginning of the third week of Advent. To enable our students to experience four weeks of preparation (the time span of Advent) we will begin to mark Advent at Monday Morning Notices and in our class Prayer time from next week, Monday 15 November – Week 6 and will continue for Week 7-9.
