Year 4/5 Vinnies Christmas Appeal

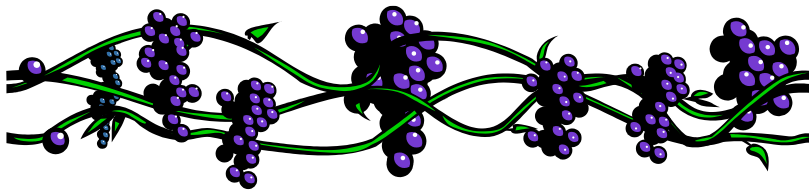
The Year 4/5 Class raised \$70 for the Vinnies Christmas Appeal during Week 8. Items were purchased for the hampers.

Today, we bring closure to the school year as a connected, prayerful community with our special whole school Thanksgiving celebrated with Fr. Matthew. It will truly be a whole school spiritual “heart and mind” experience as we give thanks for the grace and blessings of our 2021 experiences, especially giving thanks for our students, staff and families. Many deeply symbolic rituals concerning our community relationships, beliefs and actions are an important part of our Whole School Thanksgiving Mass.

Once again, our graduates will be celebrated. At this year’s Opening School Mass, each group that makes up our school community was presented with a lighted candle representing the light of Christ in every space and action of St Mary MacKillop School. At the Mass of Thanksgiving, the opposite takes place. Each candle will be publicly extinguished for 2021. Of special note will be the commitment to Leadership and Stewardship for 2022 proclaimed by representatives of our 2022 Middle School Year 7 and 8 students and year 6 students. They will make a commitment to uphold expected leadership values and qualities within the student community.

CREATING ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS CONNECTIONS



In all classrooms, and in the Reflection Spaces at the entrances to our school, the Nativity scene is the central focus, in addition to the Advent Wreath. In the MPLA the scene characters represent Mary and Joseph, shepherds, a village girl with water for Mary, assorted sheep and cattle and both an empty manger waiting for the birth of Jesus. The manger is really the feed box for the animals seeking shelter.

The Three Wise Men, also known as the Three Kings and astrologers from lands to the East of Israel, have been travelling around the nooks and crannies of our school passageways, and even the library, following the Eastern Star to the stable. They arrive this week at the stable for a visit to the special new baby – Jesus – who is also now lying in the manger!



However, the story of the birth of Jesus more than 2000 years ago would be like any other cute baby story if it were not for the fact that the scene in the stable is directly linked to the cross of Jesus. It marks the entry of God right into the heart of the human condition through Jesus. God comes to be one of us – in the person of Jesus. The birth of this small baby changed the world and brought with it the message of love, compassion, justice and forgiveness which is indeed still deeply meaningful today. It is through this message that Jesus opens up for us the presence of God in our daily lives.

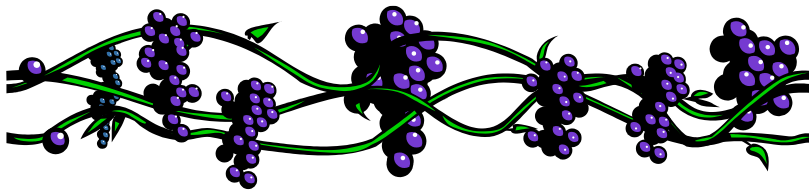
Christmas is such a bright celebration, full of hope for a grace-filled future!

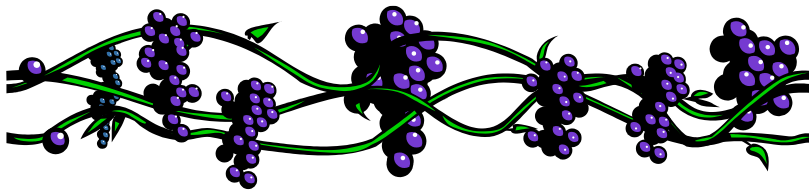


CHAPLAINCY

The role of Pastoral Care Support, for our school community, in particular our students and families, has been a very busy one during 2021. It is a strong presence in our community. Relationships are crucial to the mental health and wellbeing of all individuals, whether students, staff or families. The disruption, through incredible restrictions to our personal freedoms, and to our own personal mental health and wellbeing has been particularly challenging. There seems to be a growing negativity and a celebration of divisions in society. Maintaining a positive perspective can be extremely wearing and lead to self-doubt.

The Chaplaincy role is supported by funding from the Federal Government which is distributed through the State Government. Students are increasingly seeking a listening ear and support for solving their own challenges. Awareness of the need to be in charge of one's own destiny is growing generally for our student body, as they independently seek more support for this. Informal and formal conversations have been very beneficial for building a personal sense of self and positive connections with others.

"Breakfast Bites" has usually happened on the oval, Wednesday mornings before school. At this time, everyone is invited to have a piece of toast or fruit or a bowl of Weetbix or Nutri-Grain. In the past, some items were donated to help us keep this gift to our students in place. "Breakfast Bites" was attempted again this year after the COVID-19 disruption last year. However, it only lasted in a modified form for a short while. We hope that "Breakfast Bites" will return next year!

Updated Medical Information

If your child has a medical condition, please read the following.

For all children who attend our OSHC who have a medical condition, are required to have updated medical information around their condition every 12 months. This includes having a medical management plan that is updated every 12 months and signed by a medical professional, updated Action Plans from ASCIA as well as any further information that can help with the child's medical condition.

Form were sent home in mid-October. If you require another form or have any questions, please speak with Lisa.

If your child is booked into OSHC and then does not need to attend for some reason, or is absent from school, you need to inform OSHC staff before 1.00pm or you may be charged. This allows us time to offer bookings to other families and adjust our staffing. You can either call or send a TXT to 0437 659 137. Thank you.
