#### STUDENT PULSE CHECK-IN

This week and next week, students will participate in the student pulse check-in survey, this is conducted in Weeks 5-6 every term. The students respond to questions about their wellbeing, how they feel supported by their teacher, whether they feel they have a say in their learning, whether they feel safe and connected at school. The feedback is used to monitor student wellbeing and learning and help us improve our practices.

#### SPORT UNIFORM IN THE LEAD UP TO SPORTS DAY

On sport lesson days and dance lesson days, students are asked to wear their House top and sports shorts. If a House top is not available for some reason, (waiting for the order to arrive or being washed) students wear their usual sport uniform top and sports shorts.

There will be some extra days that students will be asked to wear sport uniform in the lead up to Sports Day, on these days, students may wear their House top.

#### Week 5

In addition to any regular sport and dance lesson days, tomorrow – Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March, students in Years 3-8 who are interested in trialling for long jump will do so at recess and lunch time. Students who will be doing the long jump trials are asked to wear sport uniform (as outlined above) on this day.

#### Week 6.

Monday – sport uniform for all students

Wednesday – regardless of whether this is a usual dance or sport lesson day ALL students wear formal uniform for Blessing and Opening of the Sacred Heart Centre

Thursday – sport uniform for all students

If students have sport or dance on Tuesday or Friday, they wear sport uniform these days as well in Week 6.

#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### PERSONAL PLANS FOR LEARNING

As outlined last year, Personal Plans for Learning for students are in place for 12 months from the end of Term 1, 2021 until the end of Term 1, 2022. This is to ensure that there is not a period of time at the beginning of the year when there is not a plan in place. If your child was on a PPL last year in our school, this is the plan that is currently in place for your child. The only exception to this is students who are new enrolments or they were not actually on a plan last year and the need has since evolved.

Over the coming weeks, teachers will begin the process of revising and writing new PPLs for students who require these. The aim will be to have these available for parents and caregivers to discuss at the parent/teacher interviews to be held at the start of Term 2.

#### **PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS**

Formal parent/teacher interviews will be held in Week 2 of Term 2, this is later than has been our past practice due to the staggered start to the school year.

This does not mean that teachers and parents cannot catch up before this time, in fact the opposite is encouraged. Teachers and parents are expected to communicate regularly by phone call, email, seesaw.


#### FROM THE APRIM

## General Capabilities & Living, Leading, Learning Framework

While the start to 2022 has been different from previous years, everyone is now back at school and engaging in learning across the curriculum. The beginning of the year includes the integration of Social & Emotional Learning from Reception to Year 8. This is an opportune time for students to set goals, learn about the capabilities and work on improving their <u>Personal & Social</u> <u>Capability</u> through group tasks.



There are seven General Capabilities in the Australian Curriculum:

- Literacy
- Numeracy
- Information and Communication Technology (ICT)
- Critical and Creative Thinking
- Personal and Social
- Ethical Understanding
- Intercultural Understanding

This is a snap-shot of some of the Social & Emotional Learning covered so far:

- Learning about how to stay safe at school and when using the Internet.
- Working on trust network activities and unpacking the school S.A.F.E. Acronym.
- Revisiting whole school Restorative Practices and reinforcing the common language across the school using circle time, role play, group discussions etc.
- Setting capability goals.
- Unpacking our school values.
- Developing a code of conduct in each classroom that fosters student agency.
- Using the Program Achieve Keys to Success.
- Playing games to learn cooperative behaviours such as using manners and being respectful.
