#### **STAFFING**

There is a general shortage of teaching staff in the Copper Coast area and this includes relief teachers or TRT (Temporary Relief Teacher).

When our teaching staff are away, sometimes this is with prior notice and sometimes notice can be on the day, either way it is not easy or always possible to find a replacement teacher. The ideal situation is to have a TRT with a class when the teacher is absent, sometimes teaching staff in our school with other roles will forgo those roles and take lessons or a class for the day. Times when even this is not possible, we may have to put students in with other classes. All other options are explored before doing this.

We also can have the same situation with our Educations Support staff (ESOs), so there are times when the extra support that is provided by ESOs may not be able to go ahead due to absence.

The students learning and wellbeing is always our priority and we ask for your understanding at such times.



#### St Mary of the Cross MacKillop

During our Pupil Free Day in Week 7, for morning prayer, staff looked closely at St Mary MacKillop and her personality and traits. One of the stories we looked at reflected on the immense forgiveness and compassion she had. She was a prime example of being a good neighbour:

In the mid-1860s, Mary and her sister Annie were teaching in the Catholic school in Portland, Victoria. By combining their income, they were able to reunite and support their family. Mary wrote at this time, 'I have never been so happy.' The happiness was short lived.

One day, anticipating the arrival of the inspector of the school, the principal rearranged all the classes, swapping some of his poorly performing pupils with well taught children from Mary's end on his classes. The inspector criticised them for inadequate teaching. After their father spoke out publicly about this injustice, Mary and Annie lost their jobs and were the subject of lies in gossip

Many years later when Mary was in Sydney, she met a dirty, alcoholic, homeless man at Circular Quay. She instantly recognised him as her former principal. She sold her watch so that she could provide him with clothes in care.

Dear God,

#### You gifted Mary MacKillop with vision and courage. In her we see one who was not afraid to speak fearlessly your gospel of love.

We pray for the sensitivity and imagination to read the signs of our times, and to articulate new possibilities for our own day. Like Mary, may we learn to confront all that is oppressive and unjust, and empower others towards true freedom and integrity. *Sherídan Bonney* APRIM I am Bernadette Thomson. I am continuing to fulfill the St Mary MacKillop School Chaplaincy role which works within the guidelines and Federal Government funding of the National School Chaplaincy Programme.

Most of my role takes place on an incidental basis, advocating for the students, understanding and responding to the myriad of social and emotional, mental health and well - being needs and challenges which occur for our students during any ordinary school day! This Pastoral Care service is well - supported and easily accessed by students and families if necessary.

Connection with the Chaplaincy Network has affirmed for me the importance, in the school community, of a well-accepted pathway of non -judgemental listening and safe practices and spaces, which is true for our school environment. The practice of deep listening is so important for students who may be experiencing struggles and challenges. No one struggle or challenge is exactly the same – every child matters!

The students, for many years, have appreciated an easily recognisable and accessible connection / peace space – a place to quietly re-set without judgement. Ongoing, undemanding but student-led conversations help bring this about. The **Peace Space** has been relocated and has been quite busy – in a peaceful way!

#### **Breakfast Bites**

Weekly Breakfast Bites is well-loved by our students and is a Chaplaincy initiative. Breakfast Bites will return in Term 2 after being put on hold in the middle of last year because of COVID safe requirements. Breakfast Bites offers an inclusive opportunity for the students to enjoy cereal, toast and fruit on the oval before school every Wednesday morning if they wish to do so. There were always plenty of students willing, and choosing, to help with the delivery of Breakfast Bites on the oval every Wednesday morning. With the advent of our Middle School, there will be extra input and skills shared from the Year 7-8 students to complement the volunteer skills of the primary students who are already asking to be part of Breakfast Bites.
