## **AUSKICK**

Auskick will start this afternoon - Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May, held on our school oval, starting at 3.45pm. Thank you to Paul Northeast and George Hamra who will be running it for Wallaroo Football Club.

It's a great way for kids to get involved in footy, get them socialising, active and out in the fresh air. To ensure that Auskick runs smoothly for our school:

- Parents and Auskick coaches are responsible for the children during Auskick, not school and OSHC staff
- Families remaining at school between dismissal and Auskick starting are to be on the oval side only, not the playground side of our school
- Children changing for Auskick may use the OSHC/Hall toilets, MPLA toilets are not to be used for this purpose
- When Auskick has concluded please leave the oval so that our OSHC children and staff can have full use of the facilities again

We appreciate your assistance with this for a good season of Auskick.

## **OSHC ON AUSKICK AFTERNOONS**

On Wednesday afternoons while Auskick is on, OSHC will start on the playground side of our school from 3.00pm, and will move back over to the Hall once Auskick has wound up.

The OSHC children really love and need their own big space to get out into after a long day at school. Parents picking children up from OSHC, if we are not in the Hall or on the oval we will be at the playground side of the school.

On afternoons that the weather is not suitable to be outside the OSHC children will head straight on over and go into the Hall.
