Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Since our last newsletter we have experienced the death of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Whilst we all hold various views on the role of the monarchy in Australia, she was our Head of State. Queen Elizabeth's contribution to our lives has been as an enduring presence. Most of us have not known a world without the Queen, she has just always been there. She is one of those people who ultimately went by a single name, 'The Queen', regardless of where in the world she was being referred to. On 6 February 1952, on the death of her father King George VI, Princess Elizabeth became Queen. She went on to become the longest serving monarch in Britain's history, and the second longest serving monarch in the world. This year she celebrated her Platinum Jubilee (70 years) with celebrations taking place in London in early June.

There have been times in our lives where a message, or statement, or even visit from the Queen has made a difference. In 2011 she made a point of visiting Brisbane after the devastating floods. For the people involved, just knowing someone as famous and significant as the

If you watched any of the proceedings on television you will have seen ancient rituals being undertaken every day, a wonderful history lesson for us all. Having been 70 years since these rituals were last performed, we have only ever seen anything like it in the movies.

May Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II rest in the eternal light and peace of God's glory, welcomed home by the angels and saints after an earthly life of a job well done!

God bless His Majesty King Charles III, and Her Majesty Queen Consort Camilla as they undertake a rigorous life of service at a time when most of us retire.

Farewell from Kerri

It is hard to believe that my 15 weeks as Acting Principal are almost at an end. When I think back to when I was first welcomed to St Mary MacKillop, I knew straight away what a lovely community I was coming in to. The children have been so kind, and the staff so welcoming. I said in my first newsletter that I am about having the children and their needs at the centre of all my decision making. While I have been here, we have undertaken staff training on Autism Spectrum Disorder which involves recognising that people with autism see the world in a different way to many other people. We need autism in our world because we need their perspective on things. Knowing that autism can result in significant anxiety helps us to also understand what we can all do to regulate our emotions. Sometimes we need each other's help with that too. If we all understand about emotional regulation, we can all understand how important it is for someone else. This term you may have become familiar with the Incredible 1 to 5 scale, A choices and B choices, and the power of the visuals you see the staff carrying on their lanyards. These are just some of the strategies being incorporated into our classes.

I would like to thank Sheri Bonney and Lisa Caffyn for their leadership and support. They have been a great team to work with. I would also like to thank Karen Westlake, Emily Donnell and Julia Agnew whose patience and knowledge have been invaluable. To Annette Morphett and Francesca Tully, whose support and knowledge in the area of inclusive education is an asset to the school. To all the staff for their warm welcome and support and to all the children whose joy and enthusiasm have truly been a blessing. I will miss you all, and rest assured I will always carry a little piece of St Mary MacKillop's in my heart.

School Crossing Monitor Training

The SA Police Road Safety Centre is a leader in road safety education and contributes to a reduction in the frequency and severity of road trauma in South Australia.

Recently Mitchell, Luke, Chelsea, Max, Mia and Harvie took part in School Crossing Monitor Training. This training is delivered to students aged 10 years or older, teachers and school volunteers who want to operate a school crossing or pedestrian-activated traffic lights.


This training was provided by a member of the South Australia Police Road Safety Centre and educated students on how to safely stop vehicles approaching a school crossing to facilitate the safe crossing of pedestrians. Students received a certificate issued on behalf of the Commissioner of Police, authorising them to be school crossing monitors.

We ask all parents/carers to take the time to talk to their children about road safety. It is important that all parents/carers are good road safety role models.




