PLANNING FOR 2023

Our planning and preparation is well underway for 2023.

This week and next week I am enjoying enrolment meetings and tours of the school for families and children commencing in Reception Term 1, 2023. We are expecting 22 children at this stage (23 for transition visits) for our Term 1 Reception intake. The children will have their transition visits on Thursdays of Weeks 3 to 6. We are employing staff and working out class structures and student placements for next year.

When we are informed of students leaving, this assists greatly with all of our planning.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Thankfully, things have certainly changed for the positive from this time last year or even last term, in regards to COVID.

- From 14th October, it is no longer mandatory for those who test positive to COVID-19 to self-isolate at home. Students are encouraged to stay away from school if symptoms are displayed as this is the most effective control of an outbreak of COVID-19, however as stated, this is not mandatory.
- I am still required to record student cases so please notify our school office of any student cases of COVID-19.
- Some more RAT tests are being sent home for families today. Please see the attached letter for more information.
- Mask wearing is only required in specific instances (5 or more cases in one classroom over 7 days), however mask wearing is supported for those who wish to do so.

CHILD PROTECTION

Child Protection is everyone's responsibility. Our staff receive training and have recently received extensive resources outlining guidelines and procedures in regards to *Children and young people's sexual behaviour in education and care settings*.

We support children in healthy sexual, social and emotional development through explicit teaching, the learning and care environment we provide, and partnering with other agencies. In responding to sexual behaviour, we consider at all times, what is in the best interests of all children and young people involved.

Prayer of the Week


Dear Lord.
