FEAST OF ST PATRICK



This coming Friday is **St Patrick's Day. St Patrick** is the patron saint of Ireland, who is credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland. In the 5th Century AD, he was enslaved as a 16-year-old in what was then Roman England. He was taken to a farm in Ireland by the kidnappers, before escaping and returning to his birthplace. As a bishop in later life, he went back to Ireland and spread the message of Christianity. Famously, he explained the Holy Trinity and used the three leaves of the shamrock to explain the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The green on the Irish flag represents the Roman Catholic population of Ireland, while the orange represents the protestant population. In addition, green icons such as the shamrock and leprechauns have reinforced the prominence of the colour green in **St. Patrick's Day** celebrations.

On Friday, your child may wear a touch of green to celebrate St Patrick's Day.

FEAST OF ST JOSEPH

Sunday, is the Feast Day of St Joseph. St. Joseph the carpenter was the husband of Mary and the earthly father of Jesus. So, the feast that is celebrated on St. Joseph's Day honours all fathers. It takes place all around the world and usually involves having a large meal or feast. St Joseph is honoured due to him being an extremely faithful man all his life. He was the legal father of Jesus and took care of him as he grew up.

Before becoming a Saint, Joseph was and still is known as Joseph of Nazareth. He was a carpenter or possibly a stone worker who taught Jesus how to be a carpenter.

Joseph wasn't mentioned in any of the New Testament when Jesus began his public life. It's assumed that he probably died at some point before Jesus started preaching.

Joseph is known as the patron saint of unborn children, fathers, immigrants, workers, Vietnam and the Philippines. St Joseph's Day is celebrated in lots of different ways around the world including Father's Day in Italy.



In 1866, Mary MacKillop and Father Tenison Woods founded the congregation, the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart, in Penola, South Australia. The Sisters of Saint Joseph were different from other religious congregations living in Australia during the late nineteenth century. The sisters lived in small groups of two or three in country areas often where there was no established Catholic Church structure.

Today there are over 600 Sisters of Saint Joseph living in communities in Australia, Aotearoa New Zealand, Ireland, Peru, Timor-Leste and Brazil. The sisters are engaged in pastoral work as well as in professional roles which include teaching, social services, law, psychology, nursing, aged care, community development, adult education and support for new arrivals in Australia and New Zealand.

The school community will celebrate the Feast Day of St Joseph on Monday, 20th March, at 11:45am, Star of Sea Church, Wallaroo. On Monday, your child may wear a touch of yellow or gold to celebrate St Joseph's Day.

SCIENCE

Biological science is the theme for this term and students have been learning about designing an experiment, in particular controlled variables. The Year 6s in particular have been looking at the effect the method of watering has on plants. They chose misting, soaking and flooding for their tomato plants. They are also looking at the effect salinity has on plant growth and are watering the lettuce seedlings with various concentrations of salt water. The Year 7s are learning about animal classification and using and creating dichotomous keys while the Year 8s explore microscopes and cells.

I think it's interesting how we get to learn about what different plants can survive from (changing watering mode and different salinity levels). I think Biology is interesting even though it's not my favourite type of Science. - Lucas Phillips






ART



When writing, students have been working on forming different types of sentences which will then lead into forming well-written paragraphs. Improving writing skills is a whole school focus for this year.


I have enjoyed learning about persuasive techniques and different writing styles, and I really hope my letter gets approved by Ms Miller – Adelaide White
