We wish the Wallaroo Football Club an excellent season.


NATIONAL WALK SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY - FRIDAY, 19TH MAY

KERNEWEK LOWENDER – ST MARY MACKILLOP SINGERS

It's happening! Next week, <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>16th May</u> our St Mary MacKillop Singers group is contributing, in song, to the Dressing of the Graves at Wallaroo Cemetery.

The event begins at 1pm and, according to the Kernewek Lowender committee, concludes about 3pm. We sing at the grave of Caroline Carleton, an English -born South Australian poet who is best known for her prize — winning poem "Song of Australia" in 1859. It was put to music by Carl Linger and became a patriotic song mainly sung by children in South Australian schools, especially in the 1950s and 1960s. then a short time later we sing "Footprints in the Sand", composed by North Beach local, Graeme Clarke.

Our students are also creating the floral tributes which will be placed at each grave which is honoured.

The Singers will be travelling in a bus provided by the Kernewek. We will be leaving school at approximately 12:30pm after an early lunch.

Tickets Required

Any parents who wish to come will need to arrange a ticket from the kernewek.org website. They are free. This is just how Kernewek Lowender wants us to operate - under COVID conditions. I will be completing a Contact Tracing form, with all of the children's names on it, in advance. Whilst parents need to download a ticket, another quirk of the COVID plan that we are operating under will also <u>require the parents to sign in at the cemetery entrance</u> as well.

I extend my grateful thanks to the Singers and to their parents who are supporting them in this local Festival engagement.
