NATIONAL WALK SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY – FRIDAY 19TH MAY



Luke: I enjoyed competing against other students from other schools and catching up with my friends.


Riley: I had the opportunity to participate in all the events that I enjoy, I also enjoyed going to Kadina School and seeing my friends.
