NAPLAN

With today's Newsletter, parents of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will receive a pamphlet produced by ACARA with information about the NAPLAN testing.

Students will have a practice test session on Tuesday, 25th February between 9-10am, this will include all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students. The practice test is an omnibus test, meaning it has samples of questions across all of the areas of testing: reading, language conventions and maths. The test is held in test conditions however teachers also have the flexibility in this time to explain to students the various tools on the computer they can use, how the questions are presented and ways they answer the questions (type in a response, choose an answer from multiple choice etc.).

Teachers will continue to do writing practice in the genres of narrative and procedure with students. We do not receive any results from the practice test, the purpose is experience for the students.

The ACTUAL NAPLAN testing window is from 12^{TH} - 24^{TH} March. We have planned our main testing days for Wednesday 12^{th} , Thursday 13^{th} and Friday 14^{th} , with the following days available for catch up testing with students who are away.

If parents have any questions about the NAPLAN testing, I encourage you to have a conversation with your child's teacher.

Any requests for student withdrawal from NAPLAN testing are to be discussed prior to the testing commencing.

PERSONAL PLANS FOR LEARNING

Personal Plans for Learning for students with a diagnosed or imputed disability are currently being revised and written. The PPLs will be sent home to parents at the beginning of Week 6, this will give parents the opportunity to read them in preparation for parent/teacher interviews which will be held in Week 10 of this term. Parents and Carers are asked to then bring the PPL along to the interview for discussion with the class teacher/s. PPLs will then be signed. The PPL is not a static document but is constantly referred to and reviewed in consultation between school and home.

CATHOLIC IDENTITY AND MISSION

The St Mary Mackillop School vision is to create an educational environment that allows us, the students and our families to have a life-long, life wide love of learning. Our school works with our parish, the St Mary Mackillop Parish of the Copper Coast, to teach us the Catholic traditions and provide an invitation to encounter a love of God.

Every year the 14 schools in the Port Pirie Diocese have a theme. This year, the theme is **Seeds of Hope**. At our Beginning of Year Mass, we came together to ask for God's blessing as we begin our journey together as pilgrims to grow our Seeds of Hope and be of service to each other. God calls us to sow seeds of beauty and kindness wherever we find ourselves. This year, we are invited to spread the message of hope and awaken in every heart the joy and courage to embrace life, life to the full.

This year is a holy year in the Catholic Church and is called a Jubilee Year. A Jubilee Year happens every 25 years and has a theme. This year's theme is *Pilgrims of Hope*, hence our Diocesan theme *Seeds of Hope*.

Our logo for this year is of Luce (the mascot) thinking of **Seeds of Hope**. Luce is the "light" as luce means in Italian. It is intended to engage a younger audience and guide visitors through the holy year and will allow us to speak to younger generations about the theme of hope, which is more central than ever in the evangelical message.

Wearing a yellow raincoat, mud-stained boots, and a pilgrim's cross, Luce's mission is to guide young pilgrims toward hope and faith with her trusty dog Santino at her side. Shells glimmer in her eyes, recalling the scallop shell of the Camino de Santiago, an emblem of the pilgrimage journey.

What is a Jubilee Year?

- A Jubilee Year is a time of spiritual renewal, prayer, and pilgrimage.
- It's a time to experience God's mercy through repentance and spiritual renewal.
- It's a time to receive the plenary indulgence, which forgives sins for the faithful or deceased relatives.

What happens during a Jubilee Year?

- The Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica was opened on December 24, 2024.
- The Holy Door is also opened in the other major basilicas of Rome, including St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major.
- The Holy Door is sealed again at the end of the Jubilee.

What do people do during a Jubilee Year?

- Take a religious tour of the papal basilicas.
- Get a Vatican City Pass to access iconic locations.
- Visit the Holy Land to explore faith, history, and culture.

How is the Port Pirie Diocese contributing to the Jubilee?

- St Mark's Cathedral, Port Pirie and St Peter and Paul Church, Coober Pedy are the nominated churches for pilgrimage, worship, prayer, and hope.
- We look forward to taking our students on a pilgrimage to St Mark's Cathedral during this year to celebrate such a significant event in the Church calendar.

How will St Mark's Cathedral participate?

- The Cathedral opened the Jubilee Year in December.
- The Cathedral will dedicate each month to different prayers and intentions.
- The Cathedral will celebrate the Holy Eucharist on nominated Sundays and Holy Days.

I will finish with a quote from St Mary MacKillop:


